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| 1 | Can you clarify the term "Sanitary Risk Assessment" as detailed in the Terms of Reference, as this this term commonly relates to water contamination and does not seem appropriate or directly linked to the context of the COVID-19 tender? | <p>The term of "Sanitary Risk Assessment" in the Terms of Reference is within the context of overall risk assessment for waste management, that is all types of potentially infectious/dangerous solid and <u>liquid</u> wastes from labs or medical facilities that is being disposed of improperly.</p> <p>Therefore, the risk assessment for waste management - while it should not focus on sewage waste - it should at least raise the question what happens with the liquid waste from the labs and medical facilities. Including the question what happens to the sewage from a facility whether it is treated at the facility before it is deposited of onto the general sewage network, or whether the municipal sewage treatment plants have the capability to treat the sewage enough coming from these facilities that it does not pose a public health risk? Of course, this risk will depend highly on the type of the potential infectious material.</p> |
